Supplies

- 1 Bar & Ring Clasp (94-6016-12)
- 1 Spiral & Rivets Link (94-3156-40)
- 4 6.35mm Micro Washer (01-0070-27)
- 2 3.7mm Eyelet (01-0080-45)
- 2 5.3mm Eyelet (01-0082-27)
- 3 4x3mm Oval Jump Ring (01-0018-01)

- 6" 10mm Round Chain (20-0525-12)
- 2.5" 10x1/2" Leather Strap remnant, Cocoa (20-0010-01)

Required Tools

TierraCast Eyelet Setter & Anvil, leather punching tool, hammer, chain

nose pliers (2), scissors, pencil.
Optional: TierraCast Setting Block, bracelet bending pliers

Finished Size

6 1/2"-8" bracelet

Instructions

TIP: Each 10mm chain link measures about 3/8". Adjust bracelet size by removing or adding links as desired.

1. Trim leather remnant if desired (smaller bracelet: 2.25", larger bracelet: 2.5").
2. Center focal link on top of remnant. Mark holes with pencil. Use leather punching tool to make 2mm hole at each mark.
3. Center link on remnant again. Insert one 5.3mm eyelet down through hole at one end and through leather underneath.
4. Turn stack of components over and place eyelet flange side down onto anvil.
5. Position setter into end of eyelet and tap with hammer until set. (See setter instructions.)
6. Repeat Steps 3-5 at other end of link.
7. Make centered pencil mark 3/16" from each end of remnant. Punch 2mm holes where marked.
8. Place one washer onto one 3.7mm eyelet, then insert eyelet through hole at one end. Add second washer at the back.
9. Repeat Steps 4-5.
10. Repeat Steps 8-9 at other end.
11. Determine how many chain links you need for each side of bracelet and divide chain accordingly. (6 links per side = 6 1/2" bracelet, 8 per side = 7 1/2" bracelet (approx.))
12. Open end link of one piece of chain and attach to eyelet at one end of remnant. Repeat on other side.
13. Use two jumprings to attach clasp bar to one end of bracelet and one jump ring to attach clasp ring to other end.

14. Create slight curve in focal link using your hands or bending pliers.
